3. The Membership Committee will contact you and arrange an interview.
4. Upon completion of the interview, the application will be posted for 14 days.
5. The application will not be posted without a deposit applicable for the membership class (the amount is listed in membership class descriptions). Note: The deposit (credit card or cheque) will only be processed if the application is approved.
6. At the end of the posting period, the application will be forwarded to the Board of Directors for final approval.*
* There is a processing charge for the withdrawal of an application.

Membership Classes

Senior Membership

Senior Membership is full family membership with use of all Club facilities. A Senior Member is entitled to use of a slip and storage for one vessel subject to availability, may vote at General Meetings and can hold office in the Club. He or she must be 18 years of age or over, pays the initiation fee and boat fee (based on boat size) upon acceptance and pays dues and storage fees annually. Senior Members are expected to contribute 25 hours of their time; however, if they are unable to meet this commitment they may pay the appropriate fee in lieu of contribution hours. A Senior Member and spouse may form a Family Membership but only one of them can exercise privileges. When two or more people own a boat in partnership, one owner must apply for senior membership and the other must be an associate member, there is only one initiation fee and one boat fee paid.. Please attach a deposit payment for \$113.00. An invoice for the full initiation fee, membership dues and vessel fees will be issued upon acceptance. Should the application be withdrawn, a \$100.00 processing fee will be charged.

Initial Here	I acknowledge that acceptance, as a Member does not guarantee an immediate slip. In addition, I acknowledge that Members do not have a right to any particular slip and that the Club assigns slips on a Seniority basis and may reassign a slip during the year. I also acknowledge that Oversized Boats, as defined by the Club, require Board approval before being assigned a slip.
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Dinghy Membership

A Dinghy Membership is an individual membership and does not include other family members who may attend the Club as Guests. A Dinghy Member has use of all Club facilities and may keep and store a dinghy, subject to space availability. He or she cannot vote at General Meetings and may not hold office. An applicant must be 25 years of age or older and pays an initiation fee and annual dues. A Dinghy member may also apply for Senior Membership after two consecutive years of Dinghy Membership and can apply 66% of dues previously paid to the initiation fee and, after 15 years, can apply 100% of dues previously paid to the Senior initiation fee. Please attach a payment for \$892.70 for your initiation fee, membership dues and HST.

Junior Membership

A Junior Membership is an individual membership and does not include other family members who may attend the Club as Guests. A Junior Member has use of all Club facilities and may keep and store a dinghy, subject to space availability, and only after demonstrating to the Board that the appropriate liability insurance is carried by the junior member, or the junior member's parent or guardian. A junior cannot vote at General Meetings and may not hold office. An applicant must be 7 to 24 years of age. A Junior Member, after two consecutive years of membership, may apply for Dinghy Membership and be entitled to have the initiation fee waived. A Junior Member may apply for Senior Membership after five consecutive years of membership and upon attaining 18 years of age is entitled to have the initiation fee is waived. A Junior Membership application must be sponsored by a Senior or Life Member. Please attach a payment for \$79.10 for your membership dues for one year and HST.

Associate Membership with Paddle Board, Kayak or Wind Surfer

A membership for this program consists of an Associate Membership Fee of \$275.00 plus \$100.00. This allows the member to bring one of the above noted pieces of equipment on to the property and store it there from April 30th to October 20th. All the same privileges apply as they do for Associate Membership. Please attach a payment for \$423.75 which includes membership and HST.

Associate Membership

An Associate Membership is an individual membership and does not include other family members. An Associate Member has use of all Club facilities and may sail with another member but may not keep and store a boat at the Club. He or she cannot vote at General Meetings and may not hold office. This is an annual membership that expires at the end of each year. After two consecutive years of membership, an Associate Member may apply for Senior Membership and can apply 66% of dues previously paid towards the initiation fee and, after 15 consecutive years, can apply 100% of dues previously paid to the initiation fee. Please attach a payment for \$310.75 which includes membership and HST.

Co-op Sailing Programs

Any Member may join the Co-op Sailing Programs and, upon payment of the prescribed fee, has the use of the program’s boats and has the pleasure of maintaining them. This program requires an associate membership.

Liability Insurance

Prospective members are reminded that proof of valid automobile, personal, and vessel liability insurance in the amount of \$2,000,000.00 or more may be required to be presented to the Club at any time.

Commitment

Initial Here	<p>I acknowledge that ABYC is a working club and that all Senior Members are expected to contribute at least 25 hours of their time, excluding launch and haul out, to help maintain the Club. I agree with this commitment and I will make myself available in this regard or pay the appropriate fee in lieu of contribution hours.</p> <p>I acknowledge that I am obligated to do work hours and can not choose the payment option for the initial two years of membership.</p> <p>For required hours not worked, the member will be billed at the contribution hour rate plus a 50% penalty.</p>
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Statement of Membership Liability Waiver and Acceptance of Fee Structure

The Member assumes full responsibility for any personal injury, property loss or damage which may be sustained by the Member in, on or about the Club facilities and hereby fully and forever releases and discharges the Club, its directors (solely in their capacity as directors), agents and employees from any and all claims present and future, whether the same be known or unknown, anticipated or unanticipated resulting from or arising out of the Member’s use of the Club facilities, including but without limitation, any claims for personal injury, property loss or damage arising out of the negligence of the Club or any of its Members, agents and employees or any other persons using the Club facilities as Guests or invitees to the extent that such assumption of risk and waiver of claims does not discharge, release or relieve the Member’s insurance carriers under policies covering the Member or his/her property.
